



Alaina van Horn Chief, Intellectual Property Enforcement Branch, Regulations and Rulings, Office of Trade U.S. Customs & Border Protection (CBP)

Alaina van Horn currently serves as the Chief of the Intellectual Property Enforcement (IPE) Branch where she is responsible for administering CBP's IP border enforcement efforts in interdicting counterfeit and infringing goods before they enter the U.S. stream of commerce. Immediately prior to this position she was detailed to the Office of the U.S. Intellectual Property Enforcement Coordinator (IPEC) in the Executive Office of the President and served as a Senior Attorney-Advisor in the Intellectual Property Rights Branch of CBP's Office of Trade for over a decade. Ms. van Horn has conducted capacity building trainings on border enforcement of intellectual property rights to over fifty foreign governments, international organizations, and domestic audiences in both the public and private sectors, and holds the leadership position of Chair of the FTZ Experts Group at the OECD Working Party on Countering Illicit Trade.

Ms. van Horn received a bachelor's degree in philosophy from New York University, a Juris Doctor (J.D.) degree from Catholic University, Columbus School of Law, a Masters of Arts (M.A.) degree from Catholic's Graduate School of Philosophy, and a Master of Laws (LL.M.) from The George Washington University Law School.
