Maria Strong is the Associate Register of Copyrights and Director of Policy and International Affairs of the U.S. Copyright Office. Appointed to this position in 2019, she advises the Register with critical policy functions, including domestic and international copyright analyses, legislative support to Congress, trade negotiations, and related developments concerned with the international aspects of copyright protection and enforcement. Maria has served in a number of roles at the Copyright Office, including as Acting Register of Copyrights from January 5, 2020 through October 24, 2020. Before joining the Copyright Office in 2010, Maria spent nineteen years in private practice in Washington, DC, where she represented clients in the media, technology, and entertainment sectors and provided analyses and advocacy on global and domestic issues involving copyright law, enforcement, trade policy, and e-commerce. She began her legal career as a staff attorney at the Federal Communications Commission. Maria earned her law degree (JD) from George Washington University Law School (GW), her master's degree (MA) in communications management from the University of Southern California's Annenberg School of Communications, and her bachelor's degree (BA) in communication studies from UCLA.
